Those on general assistance, underemployed or on unemployment may qualify for state funding. Private students will also be accepted. A few grants are available for financial assistance. Classes are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; evening classes are 5:30 to 10:00 p.m. Students can enroll now for classes beginning this October. Preferred offers both training and possible employment for certified individuals.
